ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE NO. 129/OE/2023

Ms. Sanija Willson, Thozhuppadan House, Kureekad Road, Kandanad, Ernakulam-682 305 submitted an application for Environmental Clearance *via* PARIVESH, for the removal of Ordinary Earth, from an area of 0.5666 Ha., at Re. Survey Nos. 385/2-4, 385/3-4 in Mulanthuruthy Village, Kanayannoor Taluk, Ernakulam, Kerala. The project details are as follows:

2. In the 144th SEAC meeting, the Committee recommended EC for a project life of 3years subject to the certain Specific Conditions in addition to the General Conditions.
3. In the 129th SEIAA meeting, the Authority decided to issue Environmental Clearance for the project life of 3 (three) years, subject to the following Specific Conditions in addition to the General Conditions.

1. *The Project Proponent shall carry out quarrying as per the approved Mining Plan and the Specific Conditions mentioned hereafter. The Project Proponent should strictly follow the Kerala Minor Mineral Concession Rules 2015 and amendments thereby.*
2. *The EC shall be valid from the date of execution of permit/lease from the Department of Mining and Geology. The copy of the lease order/Permit should be provided to the SEIAA before commencing the mining activity.*
3. *The soil should be removed to a depth of 6m by providing benches of height 1m*

from the top portion of the site. The extractable quantity shall be reworked by the Mining and Geology Department and issue permit accordingly.

4. *The excavation activity associated should not involve blasting.*
5. *The excavation activity should be restricted to 2m above the ground water table at the site.*
6. *The excavation activity should not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area*
7. *The excavated pit should be restored by the project proponent for a useful purpose.*
8. *Appropriate fencing all around the excavated pit should be made to prevent any mishap.*
9. *Measures should be taken to prevent dust emission by covering of excavated earth during transportation.*
10. *Safeguards should be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to excavation of earth.*
11. *Workers/labourers should be provided with facilities for drinking water and sanitation.*
12. *A berm should be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation.*
13. *A minimum distance of 50m from any civil structure should be kept from the periphery of the project area.*
14. *No water logging should be allowed in the mine pit. Appropriate drainage should be ensured from the project area prior to the commencement of mining.*
15. *The drain should be provided with silt traps and siltation pond and the overflow water should be clarified and drained to the nearest natural drain without any hindrance.*
16. *The drainage system should be cleaned and desilted periodically to facilitate unhindered drainage.*
17. *Measures incorporated in the CER should be implemented within 6 months from the date of EC.*
18. *Transportation of mined material should not be done during the peak hours in the forenoon (8.00am to 10.00am) and afternoon (3.30pm to 5 pm)*
19. *As per OM no F.No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 30th September 2020, under Corporate Environmental Responsibility (CER) the Project Proponent should implement the*

Environment Management Plan (EMP)/CER as directed by SEAC during appraisal, covering the issues to address the environmental problems in the project region, from the beginning of the project, indicating both physical and financial targets year wise. The EMP/CER shall be implemented in consultation with Local Self Govt. Institutions. A copy of the approved EMP/CER shall be made available to the concerned Panchayat for information and implementation support. The indicated cost for implementation of CER activities shall be 2% of the project cost.

20. As per the directions contained in the OM F.No.22-34/2018-IA.III dated 16th January 2020 issued by MoEF & CC, in obedience to the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court the Project Proponent shall, undertake re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to his mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna etc. The compliance of this direction shall be included in the Half Yearly Compliance Report which will be monitored by SEAC at regular intervals.

21. The violation of EC condition may lead to cancellation of EC and action under The Environment (Protection) Act 1986.

4. Environmental Clearance, under Notification S.O. No.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 read with O.M. as first paper above of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India, is hereby accorded to Ms. Sanija Willson, Thozhupadan House Kureekad Road Kandanad, Ernakulam - 682 305 for the removal of ordinary earth from an area of 0.5666 Ha. at Re. Survey Nos. 385/2-4, 385/3-4 in Mulanthuruthy Village, Kanayannoor Taluk, Ernakulam, Kerala, for the quantity reassessed as per Specific Condition: 3, for 3 (three) years from the date of issue of Permit from Department of Mining and Geology as per S.O.1807 (E) dated 12.04.2022 of MoEF & CC, subject to the following General Conditions.

General Conditions

1. Proponent should obtain all necessary statutory clearances for mining of ordinary earth.
2. Mining has to be carried out as per approved Mining Plan, suggestions from SEAC, KMMC Rules 2015 and amendments there by and all other statutory rules and orders.
3. The mining activity shall not involve blasting.

4. A berm shall be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation.
5. The maximum depth of removal of earth should be as per the approved Mining Plan and as per the recommendations of SEAC.
6. Removal of earth should be restricted to 2m above the average ground water table level at the site. The decision taken by the expert team of SEAC in this regard vis-a – vis details given in mining plan after the field inspection shall be final.
7. If the mining depth exceeds 3m, benches of 2m x 2m are to be provided to prevent any slope failure.
8. Mining shall not be carried out during heavy rains and excavation shall not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.
9. The minimum distance norm from the boundary / periphery of other properties/ buildings / civil structures as prescribed in KMMC rules or any other statutory rules and orders shall be followed.
10. Appropriate necessary measures are to be taken to protect the immediately adjacent structures and properties by construction of retaining walls and formation of benches 1.5 to 2MT as prescribed in mining plan.
11. Appropriate fencing all around the burrowed/excavated pit shall be provided to prevent any mishap.
12. All safety measures are to be adopted if machines are used for mining.
13. Measures shall be taken to prevent dust pollution at site while mining and by covering of burrowed/excavated earth during transportation.
14. The quantity of ordinary earth to be excavated and the site where it is to be deposited shall be fixed as given in the application for EC.
15. The excavated earth shall not be used for filling paddy fields and wet lands or any other prohibited activities.
16. Safeguards shall be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to burrowing/excavation of earth.
17. Applicable labour laws for mining shall be followed. Workers/labourers shall be provided with facilities for drinking water /sanitation/safety equipments etc.
18. The burrowed/excavated pit shall be restored/reclaimed by the project proponent for useful purpose(s) as specified in the progressive and final closure plans.

19. In case of transfer of EC, approval from SEIAA should be obtained as per existing norms.

20. The Environmental Clearance is liable to be cancelled in case of violation of any of the above conditions.

5. Violation of any of the above Conditions as applicable to this particular case will entail cancellation of the Environmental Clearance, in addition to legal action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Non-compliance, if any shall be reported to the District Collector, Ernakulam by the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority.

6. The Half Yearly Compliance Report (HYCRs) with name of the project, EC No. and date, the period of submission with its contents, compliance report and environmental monitoring data & covering letter have to be uploaded in the Parivesh Portal as per O.M. F.No.IA3-22/1/2022-IA-III(E)-17264 dated 14.06.2022 and the website of the Project Proponent. Hardcopy of HYCRs shall not be acceptable.
