MINUTES OF THE 64th MEETING OF SEAC, KERALA, HELD ON 16th & 17th NOVEMBER, 2016, AT HARITHASREE HALL, DIRECTORATE OF ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE, THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

Day 1 (16.11.2016)

The 64th meeting of the SEAC commenced at 10.00 am with **Sri.V.** Gopinathan in the chair. The Chairman welcomed the members and initiated the proceedings of the Committee.

Item No. 64.00

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the 63rd SEAC meeting were read over, corrections made as suggested by the members and approved.

Application for obtaining environmental clearance for the proposed quarry project in Sy. No. 288/1 part, Block 32 of Koodal Village, Kalanjoor Panchayath, Adoor Taluk, Pathanamthitta district, Kerala by M/s Mavanal Granites Private Limited (File No. 81/SEIAA/KL/183/2013)

Project Proponent : M/s Mavanal Granites Private Limited

Further to the intimation the Proponent and the RQP attended the meeting and RQP made a power point presentation about the project. The Committee appraised the proposal based on the Mining Plan, Pre-feasibility Report and all other documents submitted along with Form1.

The proposed area is a government land with a valid No Objection Certificate from the Revenue Department. The lease issued by Mining & Geology Department has already been over in 2016. The total area under the possession of company is 28.32 ha, out of which 9.73 ha is Government land (with valid NOC) & 18ha is under the possession of the company. The Committee is of the opinion that the proponent shall submit the following;

1) A combined mining plan for the proposed area and the area for which Environmental Clearance has already been obtained for M/s Mavanal Granites.

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2) The CSR is to be modified to an amount of 8 lakhs for recurring activities and 7 Lakh for non-recurring activities, in consultation with Panchayath.

The Committee decided to defer the item for site inspection and submission of combined mining plan.

Further to the intimation the Proponent and the RQP attended the meeting and RQP made a power point presentation about the project. The Committee appraised the proposal based on the Mining Plan, Pre-feasibility Report and all other documents submitted along with Form.1.

From the submitted document it is seen that the area proposed a virgin area having a height elevation of 245 MSL and lowest of 195 MSL. The Committee is of the opinion that the CSR proposed is to too meagre and it has to is to be revised. The Proponent agreed to enhance the CSR to an amount of 6 lakhs for recurring activities and 7 lakh for non-recurring activities.

The committee decided to defer the item for site visit to assess the ground realities.

The committee observed that the quarry is 6 Km from wild life sanctuary and have applied for clearance from NBWL. The highest and the lowest elevation of the proposed area are 279 & 219 above MSL respectively. There is no crusher associated with this quarry. The committee is of the opinion that the CSR is to be modified to an amount of 7 lakh for non-recurring activities and 6 lakh for recurring activities. The proponent agreed to this suggestion.

The Committee decided to defer the item for field inspection to assess the ground realities.

The committee observed that though there is an adjacent quarry owned by Mr. Ramachandran is working, the geologist in his certificate dated 20.3.2015 stated that there is no quarry with in 500m radius. But in the certificate dated nil issued by District Geologist, Mining & Geology Department, Thiruvananthapuram which is attached with PFR, it is stated that a quarry owned by Mr.Ramachandran Nair is there within the distance of 500m. The authenticity of the two certificates are to be verified with district geologist.

The Committee deferred the item for field inspection to assess the ground realities.

The observed that the Mining Plan submitted is on the basis of KMMC Rules 1967 and is to be revised as per KMMC Rules 2015. The proponent opined that the pit formed due to mining activities is to be used as a pisciculture pond at the time of closure of mine. A crusher is associated with quarry. The committee is of the apprehension that the proposed area is a part of Arikkamala and between the hill top and quarry there is a stream is flowing.

The committee decided to defer the item for a field inspection to verify the ground realities and the presence of stream, if any in the area.

The committee verified the proposal and the field verification report and observed that, considering the hustle-bustle of the local wayside market, the available road width of 7.5 m is extremely inadequate to contain the existing traffic flow. Hence the committee decided that it is better to reduce the built up area to 24000m². Hence the Committee decided to recommend

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to SEIAA either to reject the proposal or to suggest to the proponent to resubmit it with the following changes.

- 1) The built up area must be limited to a maximum of 24,000 m².
- 2) Minimum 5 m gap should be provided between 4 main blocks to facilitate adequate wind flow.
- 3) Adequate rain water harvesting provisions should be provided
- 4) Roadside drainage should be provided by the proponent on his own cost up to the existing road side drainage which is about 600 m away.
- 5) Solid waste disposal system and sewage disposal system should provided .

On examining the proposal and the field inspection report the Committee noted that a project of the proposed size should have a minimum of 10 m wide access road. There are two roads giving access to this site. The road leading to Kesavadasapuram have width ranging from 5.0 to 5.2 m and the one leading Muttada- Marappalam road is having a width of 5.2 to 5.7. These two roads cannot carry the traffic generated by the project of this size which will result in severe traffic bottlenecks in TKD road as well as road on other road leading to Kesavadasapuram thereby seriously affecting the surrounding population. Therefore the committee decided to recommend to SEIAA to reject the proposal. It is also observed that the cadastral map provided is of Madathuvilakom village where as the proposal is in Kowdiar Village.

Therefore condition numbers 2 and 4 recommended in the 52nd meeting of SEAC are sufficient enough to safeguard against the vulnerability. Hence **EC can be issued as recommended earlier.**

If the proponent comes under the purview of the Companies Act, he is even otherwise legally bound to apportion the stipulated amount for the CSR activities.
