ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE NO. 117/O.C/2024

Sri. Haneefa. M. H, Madathiparambil House, South Aduvassery P.O., Ernakulam-683578, read as 1st paper above, submitted an application for Environmental Clearance for the Ordinary Clay Mining Project for an area of 0.2023 Ha at Re-Survey No. 4/3 in Kollengode 2 Village, Chittur Taluk, Palakkad.

2. After due appraisal, in the 161st SEAC meeting, the Committee recommended EC for the mine life of 2 years subject to certain Specific Conditions in addition to the General Conditions.

3. In the 141st meeting of SEIAA, the Authority perused the proposal and noted the decisions of various SEAC meetings held on different dates. Authority noticed that the SEAC had appraised the project based on Form 1, Pre-Feasibility Report, Mining Plan and the additional details/documents obtained from the Project Proponent during appraisal. As per the approved mining plan, the mine life is 2 years. The Authority also noticed that, the SEAC in its 161st meeting, recommended EC for the mine life of 2 years, subject to certain Specific Conditions in addition to the General Conditions.

In the above circumstances, the Authority decided to issue Environmental Clearance for the project life of 2 (two) years, subject to the following Specific Conditions in addition to the General Conditions.

- 1. The Project Proponent shall carry out quarrying as per the approved Mining Plan and the Specific Conditions mentioned hereafter. The Project Proponent should strictly follow the Kerala Minor Mineral Concession Rules 2015 and amendments thereby.*
- 2. The EC shall be valid from the date of execution of permit/lease from the Department of Mining and Geology. The copy of the permit / lease order should be provided to the SEIAA before commencing the mining activity.*
- 3. The excavation activity should be restricted to 2m above the groundwater table at the site.*
- 4. The excavated pit should be restored by the project proponent for agriculture and other useful purposes as per the affidavit submitted by the PP.*
- 5. The excavation activity should not involve blasting.*
- 6. The excavation activity should not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.*
- 7. Appropriate fencing all around the excavated pit should be made to prevent any mishap.*
- 8. Measures should be taken to prevent dust emissions by covering excavated earth during transportation.*

9. *Safeguards should be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to the excavation of earth.*
10. *Workers/laborers should be provided with facilities for drinking water and sanitation.*
11. *A berm should be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of the proposed excavation.*
12. *A minimum distance of 50m from any civil structure should be kept from the periphery of the project area.*
13. *No water logging should be allowed in the mine pit. Appropriate drainage should be ensured from the project area prior to the commencement of mining.*
14. *The drain should be provided with silt traps and siltation pond and the overflow water should be clarified and drained to the nearest natural drain without any hindrance.*
15. *The drainage system should be cleaned and desilted periodically to facilitate unhindered drainage.*
16. *Measures incorporated in the CER should be implemented within 6 months from the date of EC.*
17. *Transportation of mined material should not be done during the peak hours in the forenoon (8.00am to 10.00am) and afternoon (3.30pm to 5.00 pm)*
18. *As per OM no F.No.22-65/2017-IA.III dated 30th September 2020, under Corporate Environmental Responsibility (CER) the Project Proponent should implement the Environment Management Plan (EMP)/CER as directed by SEAC during appraisal, covering the issues to address the environmental problems in the project region, from the beginning of the project, indicating both physical and financial targets year wise. The EMP/CER shall be implemented in consultation with Local Self Govt. Institutions. A copy of the approved EMP/CER shall be made available to the concerned Panchayat for information and implementation support. The indicated cost for implementation of CER activities shall be 2% of the project cost.*
19. *As per the directions contained in the OM F.No.22-34/2018-IA.III dated 16th January 2020 issued by MoEF&CC, in obedience to the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court the Project Proponent shall, undertake re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to his mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna etc. The compliance*

of this direction shall be included in the Half Yearly Compliance Report which will be monitored by SEAC at regular intervals.

20. *The violation of EC condition may lead to cancellation of EC and action under The Environment (Protection) Act 1986.*

4. Environmental Clearance, under Notification S.O. No.1533 (E) dated 14.09.2006 of the Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India, is hereby accorded to Sri. Haneefa. M. H, Madathiparambil House, South Aduvassery P.O., Ernakulam, for the Ordinary Clay mining for an area of 0.2023Ha at Re-Survey No. 4/3 in Kollengode 2 Village, Chittur Taluk, Palakkad, for the quantity re-assessed by the Mining and Geology Department as per specific condition No.(3), for a period of two (2) years from the date of issue of mine permit, from the Mining and Geology Department subject to the Specific Conditions suggested by SEIAA in Para 3 above in addition to the following General Conditions.

General Conditions

1. *Proponent should obtain all necessary statutory clearances for mining.*
2. *Appropriate fencing all around the burrowed/excavated pit shall be made to prevent any mishap.*
3. *Proper retaining wall shall be provided for safeguarding the immediately adjacent property, other buildings and civil structures, if necessary.*
4. *A berm shall be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation or as specified in mining plan.*
5. *Mining shall be done as per mining plan and suggestions by SEAC.*
6. *The excavation shall not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.*
7. *Appropriate measures shall be taken to prevent dust pollution, if any caused during clay mining.*
8. *Safeguards shall be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to burrowing/excavation of ordinary clay.*
9. *Provide 2m x 2m benches for mining depth greater than 3m to prevent slope failures, if requires. For soil and soft formation the benches of height 1.5m to 2m are to provided to prevent collapse of wall.*

- 10. Removal of clay should be restricted above the ground water table at the site.*
- 11. The top soil and over burden, if any shall be stacked in separate demarcated area and shall be used for reclaiming the excavated area. Proper measures shall be provided to prevent the erosion of the stacked material.*
- 12. The burrowed/excavated pit shall be restored by the project proponent for useful purpose(s) as specified in the mining plan.*
- 13. Measures shall be taken to prevent dust pollution, if any by covering of burrowed/excavated clay during transportation*
- 14. Applicable labour laws for mining shall be followed. Proper masks and onsite facilities shall be provided to the workers. All safety measures shall be followed while cutting laterite using machines.*
- 15. Mine has to be closed as per progressive mine closure plan and final mine closure plan.*
- 16. If EC period is more than 6 months, half yearly compliance report shall be submitted to SEIAA.*
- 17. The Environmental Clearance shall be liable to be cancelled in case of violation of any of the above conditions.*
- 18. The minimum distance norm from the boundary/periphery of other properties buildings/civil structures as prescribed in KMMC Rules and other statutory rules and orders shall be followed.*
- 19. Suitable indigenous plants should be planted around the mining area and sides of the haul road as green belt.*

5. Validity of the Environmental Clearance will be for a period of **Two (2) years** from the date of execution of valid mine lease / permit from Mining & Geology Department, subject to the review by SEAC or early review of EC in case of violation or non-compliance of Specific and General conditions above or genuine complaints from residents within the security area of the quarry.

6. Violation of any of the above Specific & General Conditions as applicable to the particular case will entail cancellation of the Environmental Clearance, in addition to legal action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Non-compliance, if any shall be reported to the **District Collector, Palakkad** by the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA), Kerala.

7. The Half Yearly Compliance Report (HYCRs) with name of the project, EC No. and date, the period of submission with its contents, compliance report and environmental monitoring data & covering letter have to be uploaded in the Parivesh Portal as per O.M. F.No.IA3-22/1/2022-IA-III(E)-17264 dated 14.06.2022 and the website of the Project Proponent. Hardcopy of HYCRs shall not be acceptable.
