ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE NO.59/L/2020

Sri.Abu Thahir P.K, S/o.Kunjalikutty, Pandikadavath House, Oorakam, Melmuri P.O, Malappuram-676519, has submitted an application in SEIAA for Environmental Clearance as per the reference read as second paper above for mining of laterite stone from the land in Re Sy. No. 298/2 at Cheekodu Village, Kondotty Taluk, Malappuram District.

The proposal is for mining of laterite stone from an area of 0.6869 Hectares for commercial purpose.

2. The proposal was placed in the 97th SEAC meeting held on 21st & 22nd May 2019. The proponent invited for presentation and also directed to submit photographs of the site. The decision of the Committee was intimated to the Proponent.

3. The proposal was placed in the 98th meeting of SEAC held on 03rd June 2019. The proponent was present during the meeting. The proponent has not furnished the requisite documents and hence the proponent is directed to submit letter of intent/approved mining plan. The proponent has submitted the pertinent documents on 21.01.2020.

4. The proposal was placed in the 109th meeting of SEAC held on 31st & 01st February 2020. The Committee decided to recommend for issuance of EC for mining of laterite stone subject to a maximum quantity of 35000 m³.

5. The proposal was placed in the 103rd meeting of SEIAA held on 24th & 25th February 2020. Authority decided to issue EC for one year for a quantity of 35000 m³ of laterite stone subject to the following specific conditions in addition to general conditions.

- 1) *Activities relating to Corporate Environmental Responsibility for an amount to be fixed later shall be carried out leading to protection and promotion of environment including waste management in the project district as per OM F.No.22-65/2017-IA-III dt.01.05.2018 of MoEF & CC as directed by Director, Directorate of Environment & Climate Change and supervised by District Collector.*
- 2) *The proponent shall carry out quarrying as per the approved Mining Plan and the proponent should strictly follow the Kerala Minor Mineral Concession Rules 2015 and amendments thereby.*
- 3) *As per the directions contained in the OM F.No.22-34/2018-IA.III dated 16th January 2020 issued by MoEF & CC, in obedience to the directions of the Honourable Supreme Court the Project Proponent shall, undertake re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to his mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna etc. The compliance of this direction shall be*

included in the half yearly compliance report which will be monitored by SEAC at regular intervals.

6. Environmental Clearance, under Notification S.O. No.1533 (E) dated 26.09.2006 read with O.M. as first paper above of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India, is hereby accorded to Sri.Abu Thahir P.K, S/o.Kunjalikutty, Pandikadavath House, Oorakam, Melmuri P.O, Malappuram-676519 for the mining of Laterite stone from an area of 0.6869 Ha of land in Re.Sy.No.298/2 at Cheekode Village, Kondotty Taluk, Malappuram District for a period of one year for a maximum quantity of 35000 m³ of laterite stone subject to the specific conditions suggested by SEIAA in para 5th above in addition to the following general conditions.


General conditions

- (i) The activity shall not involve blasting.
- (ii) The maximum depth of removal of earth should not go beyond 2m from the general ground level of the site (lithomark). The level should be prominently marked before initiating the work.
- (iii) Removal of earth should be restricted to 2m above to the ground water table at the site.
- (iv) The excavation activity shall not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.
- (v) The burrowed/excavated pit shall be restored by the project proponent for useful purpose(s) as specified in the application.
- (vi) Appropriate fencing all around the burrowed/excavated pit shall be made to prevent any mishap.
- (vii) Measures shall be taken to prevent dust emission by covering of burrowed/excavated earth during transportation.
- (viii) Safeguards shall be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to burrowing/excavation of earth.
- (ix) Workers/labourers shall be provided with facilities for drinking water and sanitation.
- (x) A berm shall be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation.
- (xi) A minimum distance of 15 m from any civil structure shall be kept from the periphery of the excavation area.
- (xii) The quantity of O.E being excavated from each site is to be deposited at each work site

shall be fixed.

(xiii) The Environmental Clearance shall be liable to be cancelled in any case of violation of any of the above conditions.

7. Violation of any of the above general conditions as applicable to the particular case will entail cancellation of the Environmental Clearance, in addition to legal action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Non-compliance, if any shall be reported to the District Collector, Malappuram by the State Environment Impact Assessment Authority.
