The 89th meeting of the SEAC commenced at 10.00 am. Dr.C.Bhaskaran, Chairman chaired the meeting. The Chairman welcomed the Secretary-in- charge and members to the meeting and the Committee deliberated the agenda items as follows.

SEAC found it is a case of violation and noticed some drawbacks in the proposal and deferred the item for some more details from the proponent as follows:

- 2. Soil test report-N values should be indicated

- 3. Details of ground water extraction proposed to be done and the aquifer characteristics including safe yield based on hydrological studies including pump test

- 5. Mechanism for tertiary level of water treatment

- 7. Impact on ground water and nearby wetland

Request for extension of validity of Environment Clearance issued - Ooragam Metals (LLP) – Malappuram (File No.120/SEIAA/KL/2186/2013)

The Committee recommended for one year extension subject to strict compliance of conditions in the EC and the following conditions additionally.

- 1. The proponents have clearly maintained with local species on the northern bank of the canal but on the present quarry side it is completed only about 75%. At most care should be taken by the proponent to maintain the green belt on both banks throughout the length of the canal .
- 2. The crusher unit should be shifted to lowest possible elevation

As per the proponents the crusher unit has not yet started. They should locate the crusher on lowest possible elevation. The new location of the crusher unit must be shown in the plan.

3. The boundary of the proposed site should be demarcated clearly by using boundary pillars as shown in the plan.

Item No.89.09Renewal of validity of Environmental Clearance for Granite
stone quarry project of M/s Chengalathu quarry Industries by
Shri.Thomas Mathai (77/SEIAA/KL/172/2013)

The Committee recommended for one year extension subject to strict adherence of conditions in the EC and the compliance of the following observations of Subcommittee of SEAC who inspected the site.

- 1. The overburden material is being stacked and provided with a protective wall being constructed on one side. The protected wall need to be extended to the lower corner to prevent washing down of fine materials and consequent pollution of water bodies. While constructing the protective wall, provision should be made for the streamlet to flow into the adjacent main stream through a silt-trap.
- 2. One portion is still steep at the base of the hill and the barbed metal wire fencing is inadequate. Benches have been made in other areas, but the recommended height and width of 5 meter is not adequately maintained. This has to be corrected.

- 3. Work was somewhat initiated from the uppermost part. Haulage line and approach were made afresh.
- 4. Reported that major quantity of spent oil is reused and the wastage is minimal; proof to be made.
- 5. The provision is to use 2% of the average net profit for CSR activities that promote poverty reduction, education, health, environmental sustainability, gender equality, and vocational skills development. The first two works do not seem to comply with CSR norms.
- a. Widening of Payyanamon AdukaduPanchayat road (1.2km)-Rs.15,00,000/-
- b. Maintenance of Payyanamon- Adukadu Panchayat road(1.2km)-Rs. 2,25,000/-
- c. Contribution to Chief Minister's Distress Relief fund (Flood Relief) Rs. 9,00,000/-
- d. Other Flood relief donations- Rs.2,00,000/-
- e. Donation towards to KendriyaVidyalaya School, Konni Rs.1,50,000/-

Books of account or other proofs for the net profit and payments must be done and submitted with compliance report.

6. Mining activities are now undertaken at Pit-1 only. Mining at Pit-2 has not started yet. Slope should be less than 45°

1. Should not sink bore wells in the project site for utilization of ground water.

The Committee noticed that it is a cluster quarry and accepted the recommendation of the subcommittee which inspected the site and deferred the item for want of the following details from the proponent

- 2. Report of public hearing

Item No.89.12 Environmental Clearance for the Proposed development of a petroleum storage terminal by Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) India in Taliparamba Taluk, Kannur District, Kerala by M/s Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) (File No. 1130/EC/SEIAA/KL/2017)

The inspection team which visited the site made the following observations

- 1. **Study report on ground vibration:** They have already entrusted a study on the ground vibration, and the report of which will be submitted to the Authority soon.
- 2. Report on Insulation mechanisms: As the proposed facility consists of the new POL storage structures and the nature of the storage materials and storage is in room temperature, we were given to understand that the proposed facility doesn't require insulation mechanism. But, the safety aspects like lightening protection, protective coating of the tanks and pipeline to avoid corrosion will be taken up as part of the routine safety measures. There will be well -organized monitoring mechanism and with support of the state of art gadgets to ensure the safety of the facility. The commitment on this aspect is given in the attached note from the HPCL team.

- 3. **Evaluation report on heat energy.** The Risk assessment modelling has been carried out by the unit and the study report is submitted
- 4. **Report on regeneration of mangroves:** As per the new site plan explained by the proponent and EIA consultant on ground, the proposed project site excludes the marshy areas and mangrove areas in the originally proposed site. The acquisition of the land is confined to only 85 acres (77 acres for the facility and 8 acres for the approach road) leaving completely the adjacent mangroves and marshy sites; They confirmed there will not be any disturbance from their part as of the operation of the plant

The Committee was also informed of the representation made by two civil society organizations against the present proposal. In view of the public protest in the proposed area, SEAC decided to defer the matter for re-examination and to call the proponents for hearing with the public hearing report. The Committee also decided to seek the action taken report from the District Collector, Kannur on the public hearing.
