ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE NO. 43/L/2020

Smt. Usha.C, Soorya House, Kuttikattoor, Kozhikode-673008 has submitted an application for Environmental Clearance in SEIAA for mining of Laterite Stone from the

land at Sy. No.26/1A, (26/11) of Mavoor Village, Kozhikode Taluk, Kozhikode District. The proposed quantity of the removed earth has not been mentioned. The total area is 24 cent for own use and commercial purpose.

2. The proposal was placed in the 99th meeting of SEAC held on 26th & 27th June 2019. The Committee decided to invite the proponent for presentation and directed to submit the following documents:

1. *Letter of intent*
2. *Photographs of the site.*
3. *Proposed quantity to be excavated*

The matter had been informed to the proponent and requested the proponent to make a presentation on 11-7-2019.

3. The proposal was placed in 100th meeting of SEAC held on 11th & 12th July 2019. The Proponent was absent in the meeting.

4. The proponent has submitted the letter dated 09.08.2019. In the letter the proponent pointed out she is unable to produce the letter of intent, Photographs of the site and proposed quantity to be excavated as the proposed mining is for over use for building construction, and it remains for sale she has also requested for one more chance for hearing as she had not received the previous communication in time.

5. The proposal was placed in 103rd meeting of SEAC held on 17th & 18th September 2019. The Committee directed the proponent to submit the following documents:

1. *Approved Building plan*
2. *Estimate of laterite stone required for house construction*
3. *Affidavit stating that the excavation is for the construction of own house only.*

The proponent has submitted the document dated 20.09.2019

6. The proposal was placed in the 104th meeting of SEAC held on 10th & 11th October 2019. The Committee decided to invite the proponent for presentation

Intimated the proponent for presentation on 23.10.2019

7. The proposal was placed in the 105th meeting of SEAC held on 28th & 29th October 2019. The Committee decided to recommend for EC subject to the specific condition that it can be used only for own purpose.

8. The proposal was placed in the 99th meeting of SEIAA held on 21st & 22nd November 2019. The Authority decided to defer the item for next meeting.

9. The proposal was placed in the 100th meeting of SEIAA held on 23rd & 24th December 2019. Authority noted that the quantity of laterite stone to be excavated has not been mentioned in the application and application has been filled up very casually. Authority decided to post the case back to SEAC to examine and resubmit.

10. The proposal was placed in the 108th meeting of SEAC held on 13th & 14th January 2020. The Committee decided to recommend issuance of EC subject to a maximum quantity of 500 m³.

11. The proposal was placed in the 102nd meeting of SEIAA held on 10th & 11th February 2020. Authority decided to issue EC for 6 months for a quantity of 500 m³ of laterite stone subject to the condition that the excavated laterite stone shall be used for her own personal use.


12. In the circumstances the Authority is pleased to accord Environmental Clearance under Notification S.O. No.1533 (E) dated 26.09.2006 read with O.M. as per first paper above of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India, to Smt. Usha.C, Soorya House, Kuttikkattoor, Kozhikode-673008 from the land at Sy.No.26/1A, (26/11) of Mavoor Village, Kozhikode Taluk, Kozhikode District for a period of **6 Months** for a quantity of 500 m³ of laterite stone subject to the conditions at para 11th above in addition to general conditions

General conditions

- (i) The activity shall not involve blasting.
- (ii) The maximum depth of removal of earth should not go beyond 2m from the general ground level of the site (lithomark). The level should be prominently marked before initiating the work.
- (iii) Removal of earth should be restricted to 2m above to the ground water table at the site.
- (iv) The excavation activity shall not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.
- (v) The burrowed/excavated pit shall be restored by the project proponent for useful purpose(s) as specified in the application.
- (vi) Appropriate fencing all around the burrowed/excavated pit shall be made to prevent any mishap.
- (vii) Measures shall be taken to prevent dust emission by covering of burrowed/excavated earth during transportation.
- (viii) Safeguards shall be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to burrowing/excavation of earth.
- (ix) Workers/labourers shall be provided with facilities for drinking water and sanitation.
- (x) A berm shall be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation.
- (xi) A minimum distance of 15 m from any civil structure shall be kept from the periphery of the excavation area.
- (xii) The quantity of O.E being excavated from each site is to be deposited at each work site shall be fixed.
- (xiii) The Environmental Clearance shall be liable to be cancelled in any case of

violation of any of the above conditions.

13. Violation of any of the above general conditions as applicable to the particular case will entail cancellation of the Environmental Clearance, in addition to legal action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Non-compliance, if any shall be reported to the District Collector, Kozhikode by the State Environment Impact assessment Authority
