ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE NO. 86 /L/2020

Shri. Mohammed Ashraf P.A, S/o Abdulla P.A., Mullachery House, Bare,
(P.O.) Kasargod - 671 319 has applied for Environmental Clearance as per application
read as 2nd paper above before SEIAA for mining of laterite stone from the land at

Survey No-32/91 of Kolathur Village, Kasaragod Taluk, Kasaragod District from an area of 0.1942 ha for commercial purpose.

2. The proposal was placed in the 108th meeting of SEAC held 13th and 14th January 2020. The Committee decided to invite the proponent for presentation with all documents including photographs of the proposed site.

3. The proposal was placed in the 110th Meeting of SEAC held on 11th and 12th February 2020. The proponent was present. The Committee recommended the issuance of EC for mining as per the approved mining plan.

4. The proposal was placed in the 104th meeting of SEIAA held on 22nd, 23rd & 24th June 2020. The Authority accepted the recommendation of SEAC and decided to issue EC for quarrying Laterite building stone for the quantity mentioned in the approved Mining Plan for a period of one year from the date of issue of permit from Department of Mining and Geology with following specific conditions in addition to the general conditions.

1. The proponent shall carry out quarrying as per the approved Mining Plan and the proponent should strictly follow the Kerala Minor Mineral Concession Rules 2015 and amendments thereby.

2. Activities relating to Corporate Environmental Responsibility for an amount to be fixed later shall be carried out leading to protection and promotion of environment including waste management in the project district as per OM F.No.22-65/2017-IA.III dt.01.05.2018 of MoEF & CC as directed by Director, Directorate of Environment & Climate Change and supervised by District Collector.

3. As per the directions contained in the OM F.No.22-34/2018-IA.III dated 16th January 2020 issued by MoEF & CC, in obedience to the directions of the Honourable Supreme Court the Project Proponent shall, undertake re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to his mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora, fauna etc. The compliance of this direction shall be

included in the half yearly compliance report which will be monitored by SEAC at regular intervals.


5. In the circumstances the Authority is pleased to accord Environmental Clearance under Notification S.O. No.1533 (E) dated 26.09.2006 read with O.M. as per first paper above of the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Government of India, to Shri. Mohammed Ashraf P.A, S/o Abdulla P.A, Mullachery House, Bare, (P.O.) Kasargod - 671 319 from the land at Survey No-32/91 of Kolathur Village, Kasaragod Taluk, Kasaragod District for the quantity mentioned in the approved Mining Plan for a period of one year from the date of issue of permit from Department of Mining and Geology subject to the specific conditions at para 4th above in addition to the following general conditions.

General conditions

- (i) The activity shall not involve blasting.
- (ii) The maximum depth of removal of earth should not go beyond 2m from the general ground level of the site (lithomark). The level should be prominently marked before initiating the work.
- (iii) Removal of earth should be restricted to 2m above to the ground water table at the site.
- (iv) The excavation activity shall not alter the natural drainage pattern of the area.
- (v) The burrowed/excavated pit shall be restored by the project proponent for useful purpose(s) as specified in the application.
- (vi) Appropriate fencing all around the burrowed/excavated pit shall be made to prevent any mishap.
- (vii) Measures shall be taken to prevent dust emission by covering of burrowed/excavated earth during transportation.
- (viii) Safeguards shall be adopted against health risks on account of breeding of vectors in the water bodies created due to burrowing/excavation of earth.
- (ix) Workers/labourers shall be provided with facilities for drinking water and sanitation.
- (x) A berm shall be left from the boundary of adjoining field having a width equal to at least half the depth of proposed excavation.

- (xi) A minimum distance of 15 m from any civil structure shall be kept from the periphery of the excavation area.
- (xii) The quantity of O.E being excavated from each site is to be deposited at each work site shall be fixed.
- (xiii) The Environmental Clearance shall be liable to be cancelled in any case of violation of any of the above conditions.

6. Violation of any of the above specific and general conditions as applicable to the particular case will entail cancellation of the Environmental Clearance, in addition to legal action under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. Non-compliance, if any shall be reported to the District Collector, Kasaragod by the State Environment Impact assessment Authority
