SEIAA Kerala - Proposed quarry project in Survey Nos. 146/2 at Velliyamattam Village, Sub: Kudayathoor Panchayath, Thodupuzha Taluk, Idukki District, Kerala by M/s Puliyananickal Granites - Environmental Clearance under EIA Notification 2006 accorded - Orders issued

ORDER

The Managing Partner of M/s Puliyananickal Granites, vide their revised application received on 15-11-2012, has sought environmental clearance under the EIA Notification, 2006 for the quarry project at Velliyamattam Village, Kudayathoor Panchayath, Thodupuzha Taluk, Idukki District, Kerala. The proposal has been appraised by the State Level Expert Appraisal Committee Kerala constituted by the competent authority, as per prescribed procedure in the lights of provisions under the EIA Notification 2006 and subsequent amendments, in its 10th meeting held on 26th and 27th November 2012 and also in the 11th meeting held on 9th January, 2013 AND on the basis of the supporting documents enclosed with the application viz., the Form - 1, questionnaire for mining projects, pre-feasibility report, Environment Management Plan and the additional clarifications furnished in response to the observations, the SEAC Kerala recommended environmental clearance to the project.

It is interalia, noted that the project comes under the Category B, Activity 1(a) of Schedule of EIA Notification 2006. The proposed project site falls within 9°49'N and 76°48'E. The proposed project is for quarrying of 1,50,000 TPA of building granite stone from an area of 2.50 hectare of land. The expected life of mine will be 7 years. The proposed project activity involves about 80% of the pit area for exploring granite building stone. At the end of life of mine, the reclaimed area will be suitably planted and the remaining void at lower levels of excavated pit will be utilized as water storage/ground water recharge and will be utilized for domestic/agricultural purposes. The proposed project does not involve any underground mining activities. The mining will be done by open cast semi mechanised method of mining. Bench height and width is 5 m. The ultimate depth of the mine workings is estimated to be 15 m. A total quantity of 12500 m³ of top soil from two pits to be removed during the mining operations. The top soil will be utilized for green belt development/plantation and will also be utilized for filling the low lying areas or adjacent quarry site. The sewage of 0.4 KLD generated from the mine office will be diverted to the septic tank followed by soak pit. The daily water requirement of 2.5 KLD will be met from storm water / bore well. There will be fugitive emissions generated during material handling, transportation, loading, unloading, etc. that are proposed to be managed by regular water sprinkling on haul road, green belt development, avoiding overloading of vehicles and limiting the speed of the vehicles. The mineral produced from the proposed mine will be sent to the crusher plant located at around 4.5 km for crushing it to the required size before dispatching it to end use.

The SEIAA, after due consideration of the relevant documents and additional clarifications submitted by the project proponent, and in view of the recommendations of SEAC, approved for issuance of Environmental Clearance for the project mentioned above at its 14th meeting held on 22 nd January 2013. Accordingly, the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) Kerala constituted by Govt. of India vide Notification No. S.O. 2484(E) dt.3-11 -2011 of Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India, published as Gazette extraor dinary No. 2074 on 3-1 1-201 1, hereby accord necessary Environmental Clearance for the above project as per powers vested with under the provisions of Environment Impact Assessment Notification - 2006 and substance amendments and also under the provisions made in the 0.M. No. L-11011/47/2011-IAII(M) dated 18th May 2012 of the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India, and further subject to strict compliance of the following specific conditions, and the general conditions contained in the Amexure, which shall also form a part of this document.

- 1. The approach road leading to quarry site should be tarred.
- 2. Trucks with less than 20 T capacities shall only be used for transportation of materials.
- 3. Desilting shall be provided to clarify storm water run off from the hilltop before diverting it out.
- 4. Drinking water of good quality shall be ensured for supply to the workers in the site.
- 5. Depth of mine shall not exceed below the basement level of the office building on the lower slope.
- 6. Blasting and drilling shall be done with acoustic enclosures so that noise will not get amplified.
- 7. Entire rain water falling in the area should be stored.
- 8. The water falling from the small streams in the hill top should be channelized to the void area.
- 9. The overburden should be retained for reclamation activities.

Compliance of the above conditions will be monitored by the Directorate of the Department of Environment and Climate Change, Government of Kerala or its agencies and also by the Regional Office of the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India located at Bangalore. Necessary support for entry and inspection should be provided by the project proponent to the staff of the Directorate and Ministry for monitoring purposes.

STATE ENVIRONMENT IMPACT ASSESSMENT AUTOHORITY KERALA

GENERAL CONDITIONS (for mining projects)

- (i) Rain water harvesting to collect and utilize the entire water falling in land area should be provided
- (ii) Environment Monitoring Cell as agreed under the affidavit filed by the proponent should be formed and made functional.
- (iii) Suitable avenue trees should be planted along either side of the tarred road and open parking areas, if any, inclusive of approach road and internal roads.
- (iv) The project shall incorporate devices for solar energy generation and utilization wherever possible.
- (v) Sprinklers shall be installed and used in the project site to contain dust emissions.
- (vi) The eco-restoration plan submitted with the proposal should be fully implemented.
- (vii) Barbed metal wire fencing around the mining area shall be provided with a height of not less than 5 ft so that falling of animals/human/belongings/dumping of garbages etc. does not happen.
- (viii) Warning alarms indicating the time of blasting (to be done at specific timings) has to be arranged as per stipulations of Explosive Department.
 - (ix) Access roads to the quarry shall be tarred to contain dust emissions that may arise during transportation of materials.
 - (x) Acoustic enclosures should have been provided to reduce sound amplifications in addition to the provisions of green belt and hollow brick envelop for crushers so that the noise level is kept within prescribed standards given by CPCB.
 - (xi) Assurance in the form of affidavit should be given to SEIAA that eco-restoration including the mine closure plan shall be done at the own cost of the project proponent.
- (xii) Assurance in the form of affidavit should be given to SEIAA that only a maximum of 10 percent of the total mined area shall be retained as water body, which shall be lined properly and further provided with protective wall to prevent accidents.
- (xiii) Garland drains to be provided in the lower slopes around the core area to channelize storm water.
- (xiv) Debris/ silt traps to be provided to prevent entry of dust and quarry wastes entering the main streams.
- (xv) All other statutory clearances should have been obtained, as applicable, by project proponents from the respective competent authorities including that for blasting and storage of explosives.
- (xvi) In the case of any change(s) in the scope of the project, the project would require a fresh appraisal by this Authority.
- (xvii) The Authority reserves the right to add additional safeguard measures subsequently, if found necessary, and to take action including revoking of the environment clearance under the provistions

- of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, to ensure effective implementation of the suggest safeguard measures in a time bound and satisfactory manner.
- (xviii) The stipulations by Statutory Authorities under different Acts and Notifications should be compled with, including the provisions of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and control of Pollution) act 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Public Liability (Insurance) Act, 1991 and EIA Notification, 2006.
- (xix) The project proponent should advertise in at least two local newspapers widely circulated in the region, one of which shall be in the vernacular language informing that the project has been accorded Environmental Clearance and copies of clearance letters are available with the Department of Environment and Climate Change, Govt. of Kerala and may also be seen on the website of the Authority at www.seiaakerala.org. The advertisement should be made within 10 days from the date of receipt of the Clearance letter and a copy of the same should be forwarded to the office of this Authority as confirmation.
- (xx) A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the proponent to concerned Grama Panchayat/ District Panchayat/ Municipality/Corporation/Urban Local Body and also to the Local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions / representations, if any, were received while processing the proposal. The clearance letter shall also be put on the website of the company by the proponent.
- The proponent shall submit six monthly reports on the status of compliance of the stipulated EC conditions including results of monitored data (both in hard copies as well as by e-mail) and upload the status of compliance of the stipulated EC conditions, including results of monitored data on their website and shall update the same periodically. It shall simultaneously be sent to the respective Regional Office of MoEF, Govt. of India and also to the Directorate of Environment and Climate Change, Govt. of Kerala.
- (xxii) The conditions of Environmental Clearance should be prominently displayed in a metallic board of 3 ft x 3 ft with green background and yellow letters of Times New Roman font of size of not less than 40.
- (xxiii) The proponent should provide affidavit that all the conditions stipulated in the EC shall be scrupulously followed.
